FAQs – COVID in 2022

Scenario 3 – Reduced staff on site

General:

Can my child attend school in person?

Yes, all staff and students are permitted to attend school in person.

Where do I drop my child to school each morning and when?

Student drop-offs will remain as per usual with all students accessing the school via any entrance point and reporting to the big under covered area before school daily. Parents will be welcome on-site pending Qld Health directives.

Where do I pick my child up each afternoon?

Student pick-ups will remain as per usual with all students accessing the school via any identified exit points. Parents will be welcome on-site pending Qld Health directives.

Will the buses still be running?

Yes, all bus runs will continue to run each morning and afternoon.

Learning at Home:

Will be child have to learn from home?

No. All students should be accessing school each and every day they are well.

Learning from school:

What subjects will my children be learning?

Students will be participating in regular classroom and specialist lessons.

If my child is at school, what precautions are in place to protect them from COVID?

Mareeba SS will ensure the Department of Education COVID guidelines are followed. Regular school cleaning, hand sanitizing, social distancing and sending unwell staff and students home will be just some of the guidelines in place.

Will my child/ren have their regular classroom teacher each day?

Depending on your child's attendance at school, they may have a different teacher. If this is the case, the replacement teacher will ensure your child is completing the required curriculum lessons.

If I choose to keep my child learning from home, will the school provide learning at home materials?

No, students should be attending school once their year level is permitted to do so. If a parent/carer chooses to keep their vulnerable child at home once school is open, parents/carers will need to contact the school to arrange some basic school work.
